## **Brat Fry Anyone???**

From Mary Burckle:

If any Ministry group or team is planning a brat fry as a fund raiser in 2016, it is advisable to contact Rob's Family Market 2330 Menasha Ave. 684-1129 as close to January 1 as possible for best choice of dates, so talk to your ministry leaders or facilitators.

The Health Department is the one that oversees the permits and allows 2 or 3 brat fries per organization (St. James). Typically the permit goes from July 1-June 30. We only had one brat fry last year and it was not in that time frame so we don't currently have a permit that I am aware of. When you get the permit, you need to let them know the dates and who the money is going to and who will be your food safety person on site. Food safety training is also available through the Health Department at no cost. If you cannot specify where the money is going, they will charge you for the more expensive permit.
