A Prayer Net for St. James Manitowoc

A while ago at the cathedral in Ely, England, fishing net was hung on one of the ancient interior columns. When persons visiting or worshipping at the cathedral began tying lengths of yarn to the net, a prayer net was born. As persons from around the world have taken this idea to their home churches, the practice is growing. Each piece of yarn expresses the prayer of someone's heart without having spoken a word. As the Holy Spirit moves you, use the prayer net just once or use it often.

Together we are a community of pray-ers. Through rituals like this, we come closer to the Holy Spirit who prays within us "with sighs too deep for words." Look for our prayer net in front of the double doors under our amazing stained glass window.

This fishing net is a "real" one, donated to St. James Episcopal Church by the Susie Q Fish Market in Two Rivers. We learned about prayer nets through the Building Faith website of the Virginia Theological Seminary, one of eleven accredited seminaries of the Episcopal Church.

TREATMENT OPTIONS FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH BOTH MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE DIAGNOSES

A PANEL DISCUSSION MARCH 10, 2016 7:00 PM at Manitowoc City Hall

The League of Women Voters and NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) are sponsoring a panel discussion on the topic of treatment for individuals with both mental health and substance abuse issues. The event will take place on Thursday, March 10 at 7 pm at Manitowoc City Hall, 900 Quay Street, Manitowoc.

In 2013, The League completed a study on mental health in Manitowoc County and found that there was a gap in services for individuals dealing with both issues. The purpose of March 10th's discussion is to explore what is working in treatment and what needs continue to exist in our community.

Panel members include Deb Wentz from the Northshore Clinic in Sheboygan who is a therapist with 31 years of experience and focuses her practice on dual diagnosed clients by providing individual, family and group counseling. Ms Wentz also provides services at the Pathway for a Better Life in Kiel. She is joined by Deb Peterman who has provided services at Holy Family Memorial Behavioral Health since 2000. She facilitates the clinic's Primary Outpatient group as well as seeing clients individually for mental health and substance abuse issues. The third panel member is Carmen Persaud who has over 15 years experience in counseling and AODA treatment. She currently works as Clinical Supervisor for Pathways to a Better Life, LLC and as a Psychotherapist for Aurora Behavioral Health in Two Rivers. She treats individuals, couples, and families with both mental health and addiction concerns.

Prior to the panel discussion, Dr Maureen Crowley, professor of psychology at UW Manitowoc will provide a brief history of the League of Women Voter's Mental Health Study and the resulting consensus issues that have led to this panel discussion. Representative Paul Tittl, chair of the Assembly Committee on Mental Health Reform, has also been invited to give a brief update on what is happening at the state level regarding mental health initiatives and funding.

There will be time for questions from the audience and light refreshments will be provided by NAMI members. The program is free and open to the public.
