Richard Hall - Nominated for Senior Warden

I was born in Manitowoc in the month of February, a long time ago, and was baptized at St. James by Fr. St. Clair on September 1, 1940. I don't remember when i started Sunday school, but I do remember attending in the 2nd grade. Later, as a teen of 13 or so, I served as an altar boy and sang in the junior choir.

After graduation from Lincoln High School, I enlisted in the U.S. Navy. After boot camp and several electronics schools, I served in the Washington d.C. area, The Philippines and Hawaii returning to Manitowoc after my four year enlistment was over. I started working for the Wisconsin Telephone Co., now AT&T, in December 1962 and retired in September 1999 at the tender age of 59.

I attended St. James rather sporadically from the time I returned to Manitowoc until the 1980's. I missed being in church and started to attend regularly. I became interested in being more involved and with the help of Fr. Klutterman, I became an Eucharistic Minister and served on the Vestry. I think that my dad, Deacon Sam and I may have done something special when dad was in the process of becoming a deacon, in that we both served as chalice bearers together at several services. A father and son team, if you will. I later joined the choir and became more active in our church, serving as chair person of the Building & Grounds Ministry and as Junior and Senior Warden.

God willing, I hope to stick around for a while and continue to do His work and serve when and where I can.

Sally Hunner - Nominated for Vestry

Being part of a church has been important to me for most of my life. While growing up in Duluth, MN, my family and I were Methodists. When I married Mark, I joined him at the Episcopal Church, where the liturgy drew me in and we raised our three children. Even so, I was 30 years old before I came to know that we worship a living God, whose love was so great that God sent Jesus to show us the way to live and the Holy Spirit to help us on the journey. When we moved to Manitowoc, we found St. James Church to be a place where we could grow

in our faith. Worship is meaningful, discussion is earnest and open, people are caring and kind while usually not judging others. Jesus feels alive here in a way I've never experienced before. This is the place I've learned to respond to the nudging of the Holy Spirit, which has taken me to experiences I had never imagined. People live their faith at St James and I am grateful to be walking my spiritual journey among you.

After serving a one-year vestry term, I don't feel that my work is done so I would be glad to serve another vestry term.

Sudi Johnson - Nominated for Endowment Trustee

'We love our church- we'll meet you by the front door next Sunday' - This was how Roger and I were introduced to the Episcopal Church back in 1975 as newlyweds in Sterling, Illinois. Both of us had grown up Methodist- but Roger's mom was Episcopalian. I have come to three conclusions about my faith story-

1. This simple invitation to join a faith community was simple and heartfelt. I've never forgotten it .
2. There were plenty of times over the years when staying home from church may have been easier (when children little, fighting with teenagers, while Roger was sick those many years, and surely while I've been able to travel these past few years). What I am learning is this: 'showing up' marks my spot in God's family wherever I am. Also, I become the 'other - visitor- stranger- ' and understand more deeply what Christian community and praying friends means. I'll never forget Glenn washing Deena G's hands many, many years ago at a Maundy Thursday service.
3. Lastly- the care and concern our family received while-struggling with Roger's hospice needs -created a new me - and definition of church and a faith community. No one could change that outcome - but what I experienced - and I know what others did as well- changed us all. We became Jesus for each other.

I'm grateful for each of you on this earthly journey - Blessings my friends. Sudi

Dianne Wilson - Nominated for Junior Warden

Since childhood, I have had a fervent desire to know and learn about God. I feel grateful to be in a time and place where this is possible.
