## St. James Annual Meeting, January 31, 2016

This year our annual meeting will be held after the 10am service on Sunday, January 31. During the meeting we will elect people to serve on the Vestry, and the Endowment Trustees and as Delegates to our Diocesan Convention. We will determine our financial budget for 2016. As part of the meeting, there will be a recap of things that happened in 2015 and discussion of what may happen in the future.

Over the years, St. James has been the catalyst for several BIG THINGS that have continued to this day and have become a valuable part of or integrated into the Manitowoc community. Among things birthed at St. James are: Sunday Suppers a monthly supper held for anyone in the community, free of charge; Kan Cool Back to School which supplies children and schools in the county with back to school supplies and Homework Club which helps students from Madison Elementary grow confident with their schoolwork by offering help with homework, reading and general study skills.

The Vestry hopes that at this year's annual meeting we can talk about what our NEXT BIG THING might be and that you will bring ideas to the gathering. Together we can do amazing things!

### ***When the Heart Waits* -- Zimmer Forum on Feb. 9**

Mary Domes, reading specialist and wife of Silver Lake College president Chris Domes, will present *When the Heart Waits - Spiritual Direction for Life's Sacred Questions*, by Susan Monk Kidd, at the Zimmer Forum, 12:00 noon on Tuesday, February 9.
