## **Zimmer Forum December 8 -**

### ***Pope Francis: Why He Leads the Way He Leads***

Dr. Chris Domes, President of Silver Lake College, will discuss *Pope Francis: Why He Leads the Way He Leads*, by Chris Lowney, at the Zimmer Forum on Tuesday, December 8. This book is strongly recommended for any Christian in a leadership role. **VESTRY NOTES**

Your St. James Episcopal Church Vestry met at 5:30pm on Thursday, November 19. The meeting opened with prayer and a discussion of Psalm 23 led by Richard Hall. Other meeting highlights include:

- Received various written and oral reports, including financials, and approved October minutes
- Received a stewardship update: 38 pledges have been received so far, totaling \$87,079
- Pledged \$11,556 for 2016 to support the Diocese of Fond du Lac, part of which goes in support of our denomination
- Continued discussion on developing various policies
- Authorized replacement of the computer in the church office using memorial funds
- Adopted a denominational resolution to help prevent alcohol and other substance misuse in

churches

- Cameras have been ordered for safety/security, and will be installed soon
- Work on the new shed is almost complete

The next Vestry meeting will take place in the Church Library at 5:30pm on Thursday, December 10. Meetings generally last 90-120 minutes, and all are welcome to attend.
