St. James - Madison Elementary School Homework Club Starts on Sept. 27

The first day of Homework Club for the 2016-17 school year will be **Tuesday, September 27** - and a volunteer training is scheduled for Tuesday, Sept. 20 at 4:00 pm in the St. James Fellowship Hall.

Homework Club, a partnership formed by volunteers from St. James Church and the students, staff and teachers at Madison Elementary School, started in 2006. The club meets on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons right after school. Our goal is to provide an optimal setting for students to do their homework, and work on reading and other academic skills. Madison is our neighborhood school and most of the students in Homework Club live within a few blocks of St. James.

We use "Time To Teach", a program for teaching desired student behavior, at our regular Tuesday and Thursday sessions. The program includes the core beliefs that caring is key, conflict is natural and part of growing up, good behavior must be taught systematically, behavior can be changed, self-control takes practice, and good discipline is a matter of good timing.

Last year we worked with up to 20 students every Tuesday and Thursday afternoon. We are looking for volunteers from St. James to help with several jobs:

- **Snack providers** - Provide a healthy snack at each Homework Club session. St James members have kept us well supplied with snacks every year. Some favorite snacks include fresh fruit and vegetables, string cheese, and applesauce in individual servings, as well as juice. Snack items can be dropped off on Sundays, or anytime the church is open. We have designated spaces in the church kitchen to store Homework Club snacks. To help with snacks please talk to Mary Burckle.
- **Walkers** - Meet the students at Madison School at 3:10 pm and escort them to St. James. The short walk is a great way to interact with the kids and get some outdoor exercise at the same time. If you would like to walk with the Homework Club kids this year please talk to Anne Schuette.
- **Study supervisors** - This job involves checking homework or providing extra help, listening to a child read out loud, or playing an educational game with students. Volunteers are needed on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30 to 4:30 pm. Please talk to either Mary or Anne if you would like to help with student homework.

A general orientation for volunteers is scheduled for **Tuesday, September 20 at 4:00 pm** in the St. James Fellowship Hall. Training materials about "Time to Teach" as well as general orientation information are available and we can also provide individual training times to work around any schedule. Some of our volunteers come from other churches in the area, or find out about Homework Club through friends, so if you know of a person outside of the St. James community who might have the gifts to help children with their school work, please pass their name along to either Anne Schuette (242-2819) or Mary Burckle (905-9690.)
