### Fellowship Hour Teams

Packs are all ages and meet once a month (that would be at St. James) , dens are age specific (meet 1-2 times a month usually at someone's home). We would be looking at being the charter organization for a group from Madison School. St. James would provide a place for the group to meet and a liaison person. Each Scout pays a \$24/year membership and can pay an additional \$12 to get Boy's Life Magazine. The scouting group is covered by their own liability insurance. The group needs a minimum of 5 youth to start and if they get to 70 they try to divide into another pack. They do their own fundraising (they sell popcorn) and are expected to provide some service to the charter organization.

There is a Cub Master, Committee members, Den Leaders, and the liaison from the Charter Org. The other leadership typically comes from within the pack parents, etc. The Council does background checks and there is required training for all positions, both positional on-line training done once and Youth Protection Training done every two years. We can also require our Safeguarding training. The Charter (St. James) ultimately approves the leaders. There is also an adult round table discussion held the second Thursday of the month at LTC that our liaison could attend and the Council is available if there are issues or questions that arise. The charter is renewed annually.

The Vestry is in favor of going forward with this, but would like input from the congregation. If you are interested in helping with this, please contact one of the Vestry members.

### Election Information for November 8

If you need a ride to the polls or to City Hall for early voting Tom Gorecki has volunteered his services. Please contact Tom at 299-6124 to arrange a time. This year voters in the City of Manitowoc will have the opportunity to cast a vote "yes" or "no" on a non-binding referendum concerning the degree to which corporations will be allowed to fund the campaigns of candidates for public office. This referendum has been passed in 72 municipalities in the state of Wisconsin, and in other locales around the country. If you haven't had an opportunity to look at it, the referendum reads: Shall the City of Manitowoc, Wisconsin adopt the following resolution? Resolved, that "We the People" of the City of Manitowoc, Wisconsin, seek to reclaim democracy from the expansion of corporate personhood rights and the corrupting influence of unregulated political contributions and spending. We stand with communities across the country to support passage of an amendment to the United States Constitution stating: 1. Only human beings - not corporations, unions, non-profits or similar associations - are endowed with constitutional rights, and 2. Money is not speech, and therefore regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting political speech.

### Companion Diocese Relationship Beginning...

Resolution 2016-05: Companion Relationship RESOLVED, by the 142nd Convention of the Diocese of Fond du Lac, that this Convention endorses the formation of a Companion Relationship between the Diocese of Fond du Lac and the Diocese of Masvingo, Province of Central Africa, beginning January 1, 2017 and continuing until January 1, 2020 or terminated by mutual consent; with the possibility of renewal at the 145th Convention of this diocese; and be it further RESOLVED, that the Bishop be empowered to set up a representative Companion Relationship Commission, in consultation with the Deacon Council, to implement this relationship, including the recruitment of persons and congregations in the diocese to participate in this relationship.

The Diocese of Masvingo is similar in size to the Diocese of Fond du Lac and like Fond du Lac is a fairly rural area. The hope is that we can pray with/for each other, learn from each other and grow with each other. The Diocese of Masvingo had their convention earlier and voted to enter into a companion relationship with us! The Diocese of Masvingo is the fifth and newest Anglican Diocese in Zimbabwe, established in 2001. It is part of the Anglican Province of the Church of Central Africa and a member of the worldwide Anglican Communion. The Right Reverend Godfrey Tawonezwi is the first Anglican Bishop of Masvingo. Starting from almost nothing the Diocese has developed during its short life and, despite many challenges, financial, geographical and political, is now in good heart. New churches are being built, congregations are growing, able young clergy are being ordained and the Diocese is also serving the people of Zimbabwe through its education and development work. visit [www.masvingo.anglican.org](http://www.masvingo.anglican.org)
