Diocesan Church Development Institute (DCDI)

This past weekend Amma Diane, Sudi Johnson and I attended a class facilitated by the DCDI through the Diocese of Milwaukee. The goal of the DCDI is to help congregations to increase their capacity and potential to be effective in proclaiming the Gospel, forming disciples of Jesus and serving Christ in the world.

This class meets four times a year for two years. There are five churches from the Diocese of Milwaukee, all second-year participants and St. James is the only church from our Diocese and in the first year. This year we are all learning about Organizational Behavior and how that relates to our churches. Next year we will study Culture and the church setting.

We will participate in projects throughout this process and our congregation will do so along with us. Our first project is to interview members of the congregation about beliefs. We work to interview people we don't know well to help us learn more about those around us.

The purpose of this education is to provide leadership skills to benefit our congregation. The training provides a fresh look at our congregation: the programs we currently have and skills to manage and design programs. Also, we learned from other congregations what they have been doing and what they will be doing. This will give us knowledge about what works and what doesn't in organizing new projects and ministries.

This is an exciting opportunity for the three of us and our congregation. We are attending at the request of Bishop Matt (he asked several churches) so that we might help facilitate learning in these areas in our Diocese. Half of the cost is being paid by a grant from the Commission on Congregational Vitality (CCV), one quarter by each participant and one quarter by St. James.

I am excited about the work we will be doing and we will keep you informed as we move forward in our learning and we can guarantee we will call on you for help with the homework!
