Outreach Update

Hope House Capital Campaign

The St. James Outreach Ministry met on Monday, December 12 and notes from the meeting are posted in the Fellowship Hall. We will try to make St. James members aware of projects we support, and opportunities to get involved, on a regular basis. A major project for 2017 will be helping with the Hope House Capital Campaign to renovate and fully furnish their new location at S. 35th and Custer Streets. Once they move in they will be able to increase their nightly capacity from 16 to 26 people and their shelter will be fully handicapped accessible to better serve women, children, and families who are experiencing homelessness in Manitowoc County.

The campaign is off to a good start with \$250,000 already pledged by the West Foundation and the Diocese of Green Bay. The campaign goal is \$775,000 to be raised over three years, and we are being asked to help. Did you know that we are one of 12 host congregations for Hope House? We are - and our goal is to raise at least \$5000 over three years towards our share of the campaign. How does the Outreach Ministry plan to do that?

- St. James members are asked to pledge to the campaign as individuals. (Forms are available to make a pledge.)
- St. James Outreach Fund will be used to match every pledge that comes in from members up to a total of \$2500 from the fund.
 - One or more brat fries with all proceeds going to Hope House.
 - Your ideas?
