2017 Position Summaries and Nomination Form for Elections at the Jan. 29, 2017 Annual Meeting

Note: this summary with the Nomination Form is available at the rear of the sanctuary.

From the Diocesan Canon 6.7 of Communicants (1) All persons who have received the Sacrament of Holy Baptism with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit in a Christian Church, and whose baptism has been duly recorded in this Church, are members thereof. (2) All such members who have received Holy Communion in an Episcopal Church at least three times during the preceding year are communicants. (3) All such communicants who for the previous year have been faithful in the observance of the general church canon "Of the Due Celebration of Sundays," unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God are communicants in good standing.

3 Diocesan Convention Delegates and **3 Diocesan Convention Alternates**: Must be a member (no minimum membership length). Will receive materials to read in preparation for Diocesan Convention, taking place in the Fall of 2017. Will also attend pre-convention meetings and possibly other meetings. There is also a chance a special Diocesan Convention meeting can be held. We will elect three Delegates and three Alternates for one-year terms.

1 Endowment Trustee: Must be a member for not less than two years. Meets as needed throughout the year working with the Vestry on significant financial decisions. We will elect one Trustee for a three-year term.

3 Vestry Members: Must be a member for not less than one year. Vestry members have the business (financial and building) work of the church at the heart of what they do. Commitment includes regular monthly meetings, occasional special meetings, potentially one or more one-day retreats, and other learning opportunities. Reads, studies, and prays individually and as a group. Communicates with the Vestry and church members regularly by mail (e-mail, US Postal), phone, and in person. We will elect two Vestry members for three-year terms.

1 Junior Warden and **1 Senior Warden**: Must be an adult communicant in good standing for not less than two years. Works as the leadership team with the rector, planning meetings and ensuring work is carried out between meetings. Commitment includes the same list as Vestry Member, as well as additional meetings with the Rector and additional leadership responsibilities. We will elect one Junior Warden and one Senior Warden, each for a one-year term.

Vestries evolve over time based on the needs of the congregation. The Vestry at St. James has been intentionally working on development as spiritual leaders in addition to their "business" role.

Voting members of the parish are persons 16 years of age or older who have contributed to the support of the parish, who is not a member of another parish in the Diocese and who is a member in good standing
