### Two Ash Wednesday Worship Services 3/1

Ash Wednesday (March 1 this year) marks the beginning of the season of Lent with worship designed to help us prepare for the season. A daytime service will take place at 12:15PM in the Chapel at St James Episcopal Church. In the evening, we'll participate in the ecumenical Ash Wednesday worship service at 6:30PM at First Reformed United Church of Christ (3613 Waldo Blvd). For over a decade we have been gathering each Ash Wednesday with First Presbyterian Church and St Francis of Assisi Catholic Church. This year we will also welcome First Reformed United Church of Christ and St John's United Church of Christ, members of Manitowoc Cooperative Ministry along with First Presbyterian Church with Co-Pastors Matt Sauer and Judine Duerwaechter. Both worship services on this day will include "imposition of ashes", the symbolic reminder of our humanity and mortality: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."
