View "Milwaukee 53206" on April 25, 7PM at First Lutheran Church

View the documentary film - *Milwaukee 53206 - A Community Serves Time*. This film tells the story of those affected by mass incarceration, in America's most incarcerated ZIP code. The state of Wisconsin holds the highest rate of incarcerated African American males in the country - at 13% it is nearly double the national average. This movie shows how incarceration has shaped lives, families and communities. The film examines how decades of poverty, unemployment, and a lack of opportunity has contributed to the crisis of mass incarceration in our nation.

The movie will start at 7:00PM, and is free and open to the public. First Lutheran Church is located at 521 N. 8th Street in Manitowoc. Stay on after viewing the film for a question and answer session with Beverly Walker. Beverly's husband has been caught up in the problematic Wisconsin parole system, and their story is featured in the film. After viewing this film you will know about steps that can be taken to improve our state correctional system. The film is sponsored by RUTH (Responding with Understanding, Truth and Hope), a group of Manitowoc County faith communities.
