**Have you been wondering what on earth are those people doing in Madison again!? Whose idea was this? CCV, DCDI.....too many acronyms! What does "IN THE GRIP" and " DO REFLECT DO" have to do with St James?**

Thank you, St. James Vestry and congregation for supporting this two-year learning experience that took Amma Diane away from Sunday worship 3 times this past year. For 2017-18, it is re-formatted for "on line" study and gathering at Holy Wisdom Monastery in Madison for Saturdays only.

Before I try to share what we have been experiencing- **please note:** CCV (Commission on Congregational Vitality from the Diocese of Fond du lac) - the conversation last fall, the survey, results 'sharing', and planned action- is **not** related to this course that Amma Diane, Chris Eggert-Rosenthal and I are attending. Having said that- of course there may be some similarities in topics and conversations - but they are not inter related at all!

The November and January sessions were very overwhelming-- lots of things to learn: new vocabulary, new learning approaches, new personalities, becoming a part of a learning application team, and how to sit and pay attention for 45 minutes at a time! Also- just like at summer camp-- at first it felt that everyone knew each other and we 3 were 'outsiders'.. AND- there were people in their year 2nd cycle-- along with we churches starting our year 1 sequence. I've wanted to share our experience-- but honestly, I didn't have the words until almost a year later! Key to the program are 3 projects to be completed locally-- one of which you are just hearing about.

DCDI means: Diocesan Church Development Institute- Leadership Training for Congregations.

St James is the only congregation from the FDL Diocese participating- the rest are Milwaukee Diocese churches. The Vestry and Bishop Matt Gunther supported our attending financially, expecting us to return and actively share our learnings within the diocese.

It focuses on "developing the spiritual community and organizational life of the congregations- engaging participants in the issues and dynamics that they face-- making them stronger, healthier, more rooted in Anglican spirituality, more responsive to God and more effective in their communities. " You may be thinking like I was--"Well-- of course we all want our churches to reflect these things and expect our group to share key learnings when we complete the program." Key however, it supports the concept that it is **through the diocese** that most congregations can best be resourced for their development efforts--**not through national programs providing expert advice.**

I have tried to summarize key things I learned or experienced for each weekend. Each session always included Morning and Evening prayer, learning and using surveys and their feedback, opportunities for active participation / group facilitation and 'real' life parish scenarios for which we could practice our new skills. I believe quite simply- this experience will help us understand what a healthy church is- and how to work towards becoming one. How to plan for change and navigate change, and thirdly, how our personalities impact the success of being a leader in the church and how to work together in planning.

Weekend 1: One of the best things- right away --we learned a few easy ways to 'get acquainted', or check in with each other in any group setting. I think what it does- is help us leave behind the 'day'..to remind us that we aren't at a 'work' meeting or another non-profit group's board-- we are a part of a leadership team at a church--

- Learning and using the 4 Core Frameworks / Visual models: (Parish Life, Benedictine Promise, Renewal- Apostolate, Shape of the Parish) - in our teams, we each took one and presented it to our team to describe the life (maybe **personality** is another term that makes sense) of our congregations -with each other as Anglicans- and thus to assess our parish health. Team members shared questions/reflections after we gave our presentations. (remember this is day 1 and we are making presentations !!)
- Practical Application: we learned about conducting a survey- and using a feedback session. For example: A congregation is given \$50,000 for outreach. How do you survey the congregation on how this money could be used? What do you need to have clarified before writing a survey? How will you share the results? For January, we each were to conduct 3 interviews with various members of St James with a survey that we were given. I think I can speak for all of us- just spending the time for a one on one conversation was so meaningful- regardless of what questions we were told to ask.
- (Using a Business model of Organizational Development), **Congregational development** is: the development of the congregation as a community of faith with a unique identity, purpose and dynamics. It is: intentional- looking at whole system (church). Assessing its health. knowing your reality and what areas need to be **nudged** to move forward, what **interventions** are needed. This develops a **capacity for change-- and takes time** based on behavioral science to see data and behaviors that define an organization.

It is also increasing the capacity and potential to be effective in proclaiming the Gospel, forming disciples of Jesus and serving Christ in the world. Another key concept: **planning with thoughtfulness and having a sense of where you are going and how you will get there -- this helps move the organization.**

Big words for you to remember: INTENTIONALITY and CHANGE
