Have you been wondering what on earth are those people doing in Madison again!?

Whose idea was this? CCV, DCDI.....too many acronyms! Thank you, St. James Vestry and congregation for supporting this two-year learning experience. For 2017-18, it is re-formatted for some "on line" study and gathering at Holy Wisdom Monastery in Madison for Saturdays only.

Weekend 2 Objectives: Learn about how our personality impacts our leadership.

- Learn about Personality type and Leadership. (We completed a 'shortened' Myers Briggs Personality Inventory between the November and January meetings)
- Continue learning about Surveys and Survey Feedback.
- Practice Facilitation and Participation skills: How to conduct/facilitate a successful meeting: Setting norms (expectations of behavior), agendas, time keepers/time frames, note taking on newsprint.

A healthy church knows about and uses:

Process of planned change: (Longer goal is to help a congregation build the capacity for change.) This is action research: Ask questions, develop a plan, evaluate results/consequences: Plan/Do (Implement) Reflect and learn (cyclical) **DO REFLECT DO**

TYPE and Personality: Helps us understand how we operate in context as a group. We each have personality preferences. (i.e. How we establish relationships: extravert-introvert, How we gather information: sensing - intuition, how we make decisions: feeling- thinking, How we choose priorities: perceiving- judging.) Here is an easy illustration you will laugh at! Three cute prayers based on the personality type for Amma Diane, Chris and Sudi:

Diane: (ENTP) God, help me follow established procedures today. On second thought, I'll settle for a few minutes.

Chris: (INFP) Lord, help me finish everything I start.

Sudi: (ESFJ): God, help me do only what I can, and trust you for the rest. Do you mind putting that in writing?

The most amazing activity was to role play a situation of a how hard it is for a group trying to make a decision based on the personality types at the meeting. We all started at first base (one corner of the room). Then were instructed to move to the next corner based on our personality preferences. People were told to move to the next corner if they were more of another type and finally to the 4th corner by a 'type'. Seeing our group visibly placed was a real aha moment. For example- If the vestry was going to

make a decision on something, we would be able to see how each member approached the task of making decisions- some moved quickly to make the decision, others wanted many, many opportunities to see how everyone 'felt' about this change- some people had not moved from 'first base'!

What does "IN THE GRIP" mean? (It means when a person or group is overwhelmed, can't make decisions.) What is a personal 'demand' web- (a diagram of the demands on our lives). Our behavior gives voice to our decisions!

Practical Application Activity: St. Gabriel's Church Scenario: 8 years ago, the former rector established a pattern of mid- week Masses. There were two priest associates who helped cover them. Now a new rector is in place and attendance is almost nil at these services. Group Task: Looking at data and seeing what it says and perhaps doesn't say. What are your hunches and wonderments? What would you do next? What additional data do you need and if so, why and what?

Survey- Feedback: We learned survey "models" to use to assess where congregation is "at " on a particular 'thing'. **The goal is to build a learning community in the parish vs crisis leadership.** Narrowing data to something attainable builds knowledge and thus builds community. A survey is used as a tool in the improvement of the parish and a tool that helps the working relationship between parish members and its leaders i.e.: when to do a survey and when not to, how to get the best results, common misuses. We learned what is a **critical mass model** and we learned what is a **testing** process: a method for setting boundaries and addressing emerging issues. (i.e.: a few persistent voices press a concern or idea that would have an effect on the parish.)
