This is a prayer request passed on via WISDOM: The people of the Menikanaehkem ("community builders" - the core team on the Menominee Reservation, organizing against the "Back Forty" Mine location, proposed for the Wisconsin/Upper Michigan border) have asked all of us for prayers this Saturday (December 30). They have asked for each of us, according to our own faith tradition, to pray for the future of the earth - especially the land that is threatened with a huge, open pit sulfide mine, right next to the Menominee River, where many of the Menominee ancestors are buried. So, please, light a candle, say a prayer, in solidarity with the Menominee and all the people fighting to keep our planet habitable.

Nominations are open for 2018 positions on the Vestry, Endowment Trustees, and for Diocesan Convention Delegates

Nomination forms are available at the back of the Sanctuary in the Information Center

Diocesan Convention Delegates and Diocesan Convention Alternates: Must be a member of St. James (no minimum membership length). Will receive materials to read in preparation for Diocesan Convention, taking place in the Fall of 2018. Will also attend pre-convention Deanery meetings and possibly other meetings. There is also a chance a special Diocesan Convention meeting can be held. We will elect three Delegates and three Alternates for one-year terms.

Endowment Trustee: Must be an adult member of St. James for not less than two years. Meets as needed throughout the year. We will elect one Trustee for a three-year term.

Vestry Member: Must be an adult communicant in good standing, member of St. James for not less than one year. Commitment includes regular meetings, occasional special meetings, one or more one-day retreats, and other learning opportunities. Communicates with the Vestry and church members regularly by email, phone, and in person. We will elect one Vestry member for a three-year term.

Junior Warden and Senior Warden: Must be an adult communicant in good standing at St. James for not less than two years. Works as the leadership team with the Rector, planning meetings and ensuring work is carried out between meetings. Commitment includes the same list as Vestry Member, as well as additional meetings with the Rector. We will elect one Junior Warden and one Senior Warden, each for a one-year term.

Vestry Update: Richard Hall (Senior Warden) is not eligible to be re-elected to Sr. Warden, but could be to other positions, Tammy McVeigh (Junior Warden) is eligible for election to any of these positions. Skip Cole (Vestry) is completing his term and is not eligible for re-election to Vestry but could be for other positions. Mark Hunner (Finance Committee) is eligible for any position.

Nomination form instructions: (nominations close two weeks before the Annual Meeting)

- Please print the Nominee name where indicated.
- Check one box for a position.
- Two Nominators must sign/print their names and date the form. The Nominee may be one of the Nominators.
- The Nominee must sign and date the form.
- Return the completed form to the Nominations box in the back of the church sanctuary.

Elections will take place at our Annual Meeting January 28, 2018

Who can vote?: A voting member is at least 16 years old, is not on the rolls of another church in the Diocese, is regular in attendance and has supported St. James Episcopal Church, and has their baptism recorded in our rolls. No new members may be added to the voting roles during the two weeks prior to the Annual Meeting.
