### Manitowoc Immigration Forums Planned - November 15 and December 6

Manitowoc County League of Women Voters, RUTH (Responding with Understanding, Truth and Hope) and the Manitowoc Human Rights Coalition are sponsoring a two-part forum on immigration titled "Immigration Myths and Realities."

Part One of the series will be at 7:00 PM November 15, and Part Two is at 7:00 PM December 6, both at the Manitowoc City Hall, 900 Quay St.

Speakers on November 15 will be Dr. Alise Coen, assistant professor of political science at UW-Green Bay Sheboygan & Manitowoc, and attorney Sarah Griffiths, an immigration attorney at the Grzeca Law Group in Milwaukee.

Dr. Coen will focus on common myths about immigration, including immigrants' impact on the economy and security concerns. Griffiths will discuss immigrants' rights and options under the current law. The community will have a chance to ask questions during this free event.

The second part of the forum will focus on accounts of how immigration policy affects people in the community. The event will feature three local speakers. Arlene Guzman Duarte is a Manitowoc business owner. She will be joined by Marcus Guevara of Sheboygan, employed as a lead facilitator by Ideas Work, and Karl Klessig, a Manitowoc County farmer.

Again, both events are free, the community will have a chance to ask questions, and light refreshments will be served. Please talk to Dan Hornung or Anne Schuette if you have any questions about the forums.

## The Salvation Army Giving Tree

We read in the news media about people who make a difference in the world and we are inspired. Yet there are things we do that won't make the headlines, but will lift up, encourage, strengthen and help. This year that "thing" can be participation in the Manitowoc County Salvation Army "Adopt a Family" program. The Salvation Army has three program needs this year: "Adopt a Family" (helping 400 individuals, represented by 100 families), winter coats for 1,500 kids, and helping bring Christmas to the 1,170 children signed up for the "Toy Shop". The "Adopt a Family" is always their most challenging mission to accomplish and this year St. James is adopting a family of seven, giving us a chance to provide them with encouragement and compassion.

Our Salvation Army "Giving Tree" will be set up at the back of the church for our Sunday, **November 11** service, and decorated with name tags for a Manitowoc County family in need. The tags list the first name, age and some gift ideas for that individual. The Salvation Army asks that your gift or gifts have a minimum value of \$50 - for that reason we suggest that several members, families, or some of our St. James "small groups" (such as choir, Book Group, or Breakfast Groups) may want to adopt one of the individuals and work together to provide gifts. Other instructions will be given when you pick up your gift tag - but most importantly, do not wrap the gifts!

The gifts are due back at church by Sunday, **December 2**, and will be distributed to the families on December 10 - 13.
