St. James helped launch Kan Cool Back to School, the community supported school supply program that helps to provide school supplies each August for lower income families in all of Manitowoc County. Kan Cool has for a number of years offered gently used or new clothing to all ages on supply pick-up day and also stocks some children's clothing in school clothing closets.

So here's the challenge/opportunity thanks to the suggestion of Mary Burckle.

Lent is 40 days long, starting on Ash Wednesday March 6. Every day in Lent find a piece of clothing, clean and gently used in your home that you can give thanks for having been able to use, but now will pay that thanksgiving forward into God's Kingdom by donating that item of clothing to Kan Cool for someone else to use and value.
