FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN FOR PAINTING PATHWAYS CLUBHOUSE

Painting Pathways Clubhouse has launched "Building New Paths for Mental Health", a capital campaign to raise fund for expanding and renovating their existing facility. The Vestry has decided St James will make a pledge of \$3000 over three years (between September 2019 and September 2022), with a goal of raising \$6000 in total. One way we'll do this is by designating all loose plate contributions (unmarked cash) given on the first Sunday of odd-numbered months toward Painting Pathways Clubhouse. This will start in September. You can also contribute cash or checks made out to St James at any time (please label it 'Painting Pathways Clubhouse'). We'll be planning other events and opportunities to raise funds-please share your ideas with any Vestry member.
